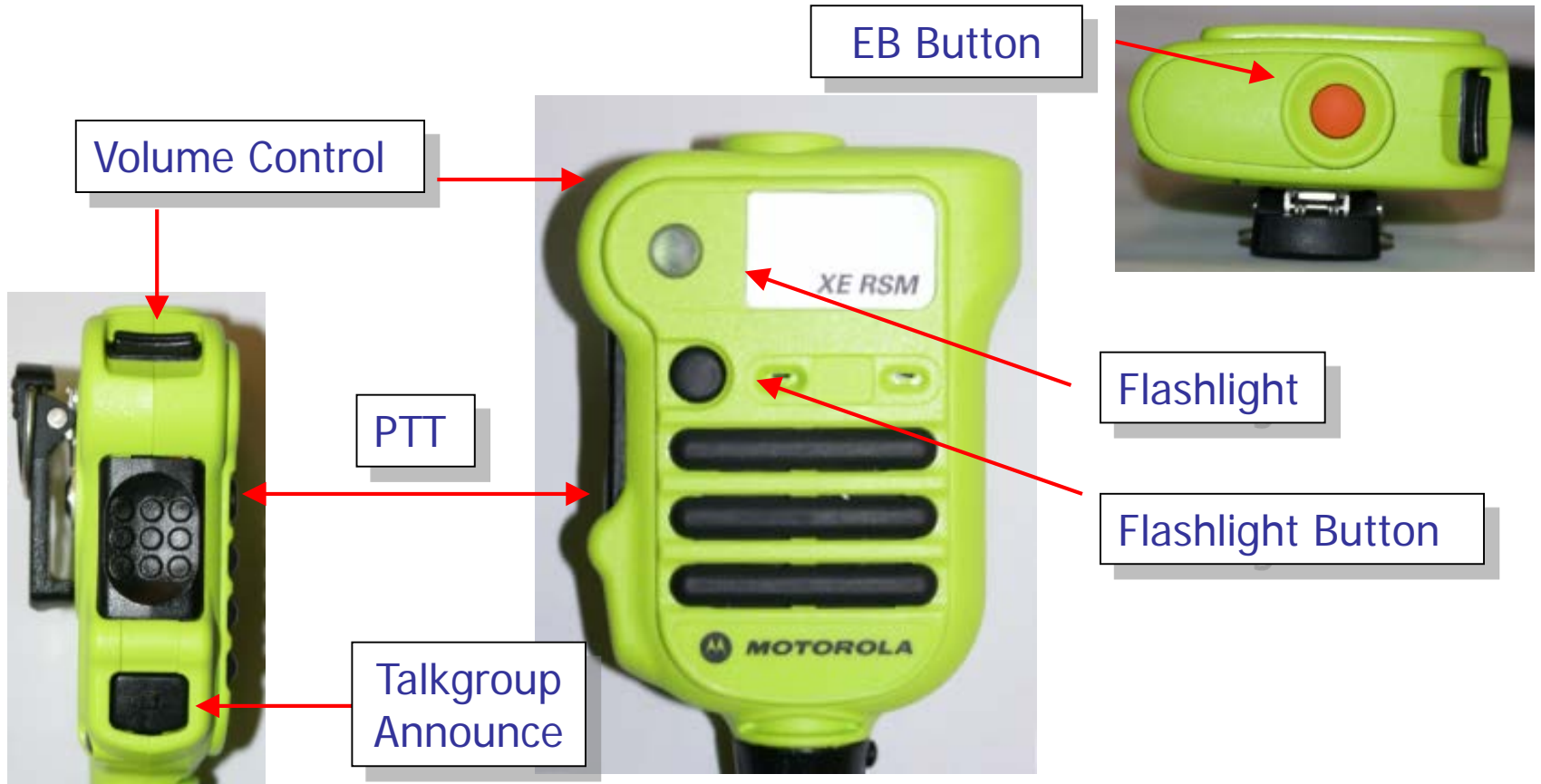

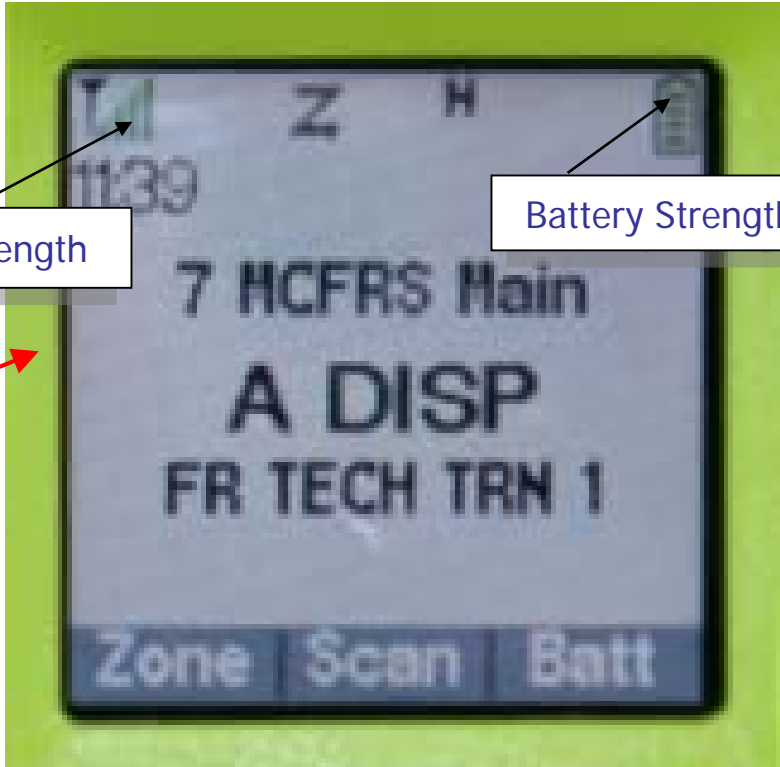

- Press the button below the **Exit** menu when you have finished.



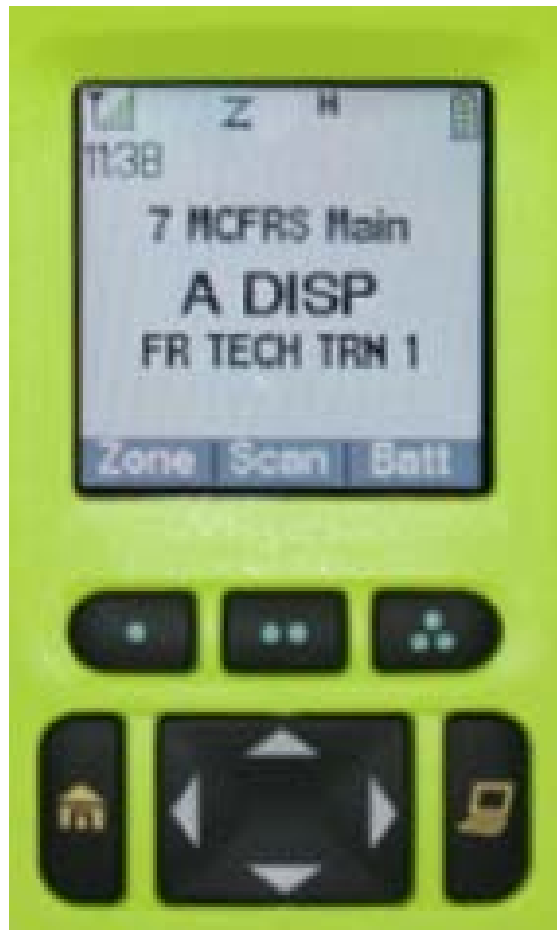

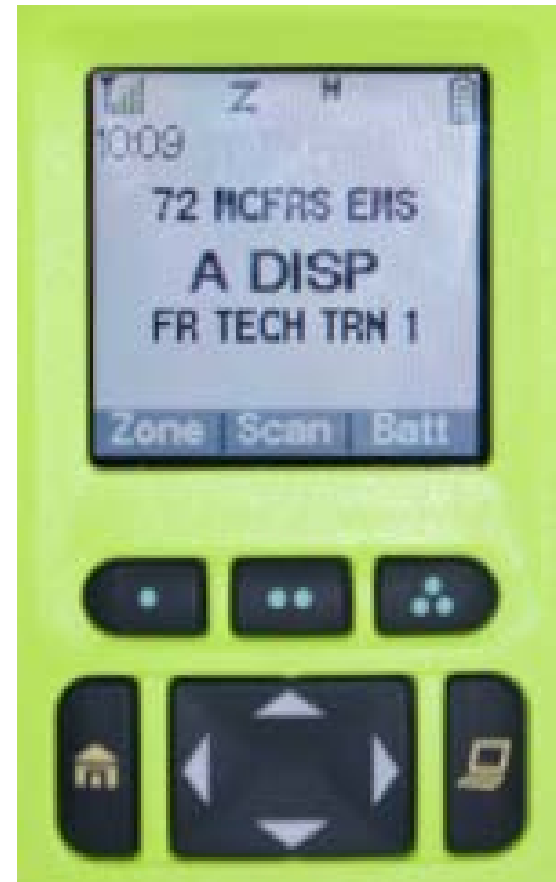


Changing Talkgroups

Changing Zones

To Change Zones:

- Click the button for the **Zone** menu.
- Click the up or down arrow button as needed (down, in this case).
- Click the button for **Sel**(ect).

Radio Etiquette

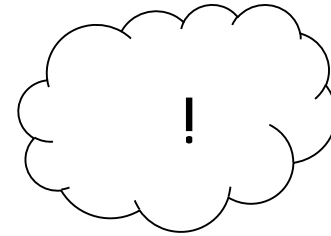
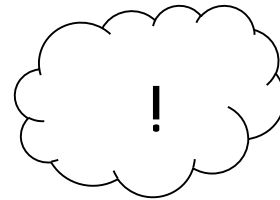
When calling someone on the radio:

- REMEMBER: ME to YOU (e.g., "CERT-Becker to Leader")
- Wait for a response.
- Think about what you're going to say.
- Press and hold your Push-to-Talk (PTT) button, wait for the acknowledge tone and then say what you need to say.
